What does Tawbah mean?

"To return.."

التوبة هي الرجوع عن معصية الله تعالى إلى طاعته

Tawbah is turning back from disobeying Allah to obeying Him.

Sins weaken the heart in pursuing what is in its best interest. It strengthens the desire to disobey and weakens the desire to repent.

And turn to Allah in repentance, all of you, O believers, that you might succeed.

Qur'an 24:31

Indeed, Allah loves those who are constantly repentant and loves those who purify themselves."

On the authority of Anas (may Allah be pleased with him), who said: I heard the Messenger of Allah () say: Allah the Almighty said: O son of Adam, so long as you call upon Me and ask of Me, I shall forgive you for what you have done, and I shall not mind. O son of Adam, were your sins to reach the clouds of the sky and were you then to ask forgiveness of Me, I would forgive you. O son of Adam, were you to come to Me with sins nearly as great as the earth and were you then to face Me, ascribing no partner to Me, I would bring you forgiveness nearly as great as it.

It was related by at-Tirmidhi (also by Ahmad ibn Hanbal). Its chain of authorities is sound.

Abu Musa reported: The Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, said, "Verily, Allah the Exalted stretches out his hand by night for those who repent until the coming of the day, and he stretches out his hand by day for those who repent until the coming of the night. This will be until the sun rises from the west."

**Sincere Repentance**: Must meet five conditions (in order to be accepted), which are:

- 1. Sincerity to Allah, the Most High: This is by the person doing it only for the sake of Allah and seeking His reward and salvation from His punishment.
- 2. Remorse: for the sin that was committed, such that he is sad he did it and wishes he had never done it.
- 3. Ceasing: to commit the sin immediately. If the sin was against Allah, then he should (1) stop doing it if it was an unlawful act, or (2) hasten to do it if it was an obligation that he abandoned doing. And if the sin was against a created being (such as humans), then he should hasten to free himself from it, whether by returning it back to him or seeking his forgiveness and pardon.
- 4. Determination: to not go back to doing that sin again in the future.
- 5. The repentance should not occur before the time when its acceptance is terminated, either by death or by the sun rising from the west. Allah says: "Repentance is of no effect for those who commit sins constantly until when death faces one of them, he says: Verily I repent now." The Prophet (sallAllaahu 'alayhi wa sallam) said: "Whoever repents before the sun rises from its west, Allah will accept his repentance." [Reported by Muslim]

It is reported that 'Abdullāh b. Mas'ūd – Allāh be pleased with him – said:

Do not be hasty in praising people or blaming them, for perhaps what pleases you from a person today will displease you tomorrow, and perhaps what displeases you today, will please you tomorrow. Indeed, people change. It is Allāh who forgives the sins. And Allāh is more merciful to his servant the day he meets him than a mother who lays out a bed for her child in an empty patch of land and feels [the ground]: if there is a risk of being stung, it will be her instead of him (her child), and if there is a risk of being pricked by a thorn, it will be her instead of him.

Ḥujjatul-Islām [Imām Ghazālī] raḥimahullāh (may Allāh have mercy upon him) explains: "Just as you have taken returning to sins as a habit, then also take returning to tawba as a habit, because through tawba you expiate your past sins, and it is very possible that you may have the fortune to die while in a state of tawba".
